Gilbert Bennett Blakely, II, 88, passed away February 20, 2021 at his home in Loganville, Georgia, after a short illness.

Mr. Blakely was born in April 1932 in Clinton, South Carolina, to Gilbert and Myrtle Blakely. He grew up in Clinton, then graduated from the University of South Carolina with a Bachelor's of Science in Business Administration.
