His dog Gizmo adopted Gregg about 8 years ago at a Little League ball park. He has followed Gregg every step taken since then. Last summer Gregg decided to plant a garden. He knew nothing about gardening, never cracked a book on what and when to plant. He just decided to plant what he liked and now will share his gardening efforts with friends and family from his freezer, which is full of home- grown squash, tomatoes, corn and beans. He was a diehard Republican and a Florida State fan. No one ever figured out why he loved Florida State. He never went there and as far as anyone knows, never visited there. The Republican thing also remains a mystery. He loved playing pranks on unsuspecting folks and he was good at it, like the time he called my dad on the phone and convinced him that Gregg was a neighbor who lived down the street and that my mom had kicked his dog. My dad spent 30 minutes on the phone with Gregg trying to convince him that my mom would never kick a dog; she loved dogs.
