Mary Louise Trahan of Loganville, Georgia passed away on February 21, 2021 at home with her family, succumbing to a chronic illness. Mary was born in Gadsden, AL on September 12, 1951 to Joseph Francis Trahan and his wife Louise (née Moore). She attended St. James Catholic School. She was best friends forever with Etowah High School chums, Janet Gray, Harriet Mehurg, and Jane Bishop. Mary obtained her Masters of Social Work from Georgia State University and founded the Phoenix Alliance for substance abuse rehabilitation in Atlanta. She was an avid decorator and gracious hostess for her husband's university gatherings. Growing up on a small farm in the foothills of Appalachia, Mary even "had a little lamb"; yet when her husband accepted a provost post and they moved to Boston, she never lost her sweet Southern accent. She was variously an efficient administrator, professional counselor, realtor, computer application consultant, civic activist, jewelry maker, belly dancing student, a compassionate neighbor with neighbors who cared (Dr. Darlene Goldstein), book club fan, and so much more! Mary was always cheerful and had a big heart, deeply loving her mother, family, and pets.

Mary is predeceased by her sister Laura Trahan, and her first husband Bill Wilson. Mary is survived by her cherished husband Dr. Ahmed T. I don't remember which non-profit asked me to sit on their board first, but I ended up on 6 or 7 committees in Lynn. It didn't take me long to realize that many of them were filled with people who loved to hear themselves talk. And talk was all that was accomplished most of the time. But there was one organization that put words into action. The Lynn Community Association founded by a dynamic, powerful woman, gave me a taste and a hunger for what “community” truly means. Meetings were direct, to the point, and above all- FUN. We planned events such as political debates, Halloween parties for underprivileged children, city wide clean-ups, and cultural and historic events. “Words to Action” is how I can best remember Mary Trahan.
