She was married twenty-eight years to Laurice Harper and had three children Glenda, Monty and Brent. She was the best house keeper, cook, wife, and above all a great mother as well as a best friend to everyone. Mrs. Harper finished her life working hard, as always, at Richway Department Store until she retired at sixty-five. She lived out her days honest, giving and God fearing. With her beautiful voice, she once sang to Al Capone in Federal Prison in Atlanta, Georgia and was kissed by Clark Gable during the opening of *Gone with the Wind* at the Fox Theater in Atlanta, Georgia.
