Albert Welch Chambers, Sr. age 85, of Snellville, Georgia, entered into the presence of his Lord and Savior on December 25, 2024. His life was a testament

to faith, love, and service, and his memory will forever remain in the hearts of those who knew him and loved him.

Pennsylvania, where he worked for many years until his retirement.

A man of deep faith, Albert loved music and started playing the piano at his church at the age of 12 and continued playing while serving in the military. He was a musician for the Gospel Group “The Artist Singers” and also the musician

for the Interdenominational Ministries Gospel Choir in Harrisburg, PA. Albert was

a Deacon and Minister of Music at Antioch Tabernacle United Holy Church of America in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, before continuing his ministry at Altar of Grace International Church in Snellville, Georgia. He was a member of The Fathers House and Live Free Church in Lawrenceville, Georgia, and brought warmth and kindness as a greeter at 12Stone Church.

Albert’s love for people and music was at the heart of his life. As a talented pianist, he shared his musical gifts by volunteering to play for residents at senior

living facilities, bringing joy and light wherever he performed. He found immense

joy in listening to and playing music, an expression of his vibrant spirit and unwavering love for the Lord. Even in his later years, Albert remained active, enjoying long walks and staying physically fit.

Albert’s legacy is one of love, faith, and devotion to his family and community. He

is preceded in death by his first wife, Clarice (Cross) Chambers; his parents, Thomas and Glennie (Rush) Chambers; and his sister, Lela Mae Jones. He is survived by his beloved wife, Hope (Brown) Chambers of Snellville, Georgia; his
