



Alice Bell

July 22, 1920 - January 1, 2021

Alice Needham Bell, age 100 of Lawrenceville, GA, passed away on Friday, January 01, 2021. Alice was born in Lenox, GA on July 22, 1920, to Dr. Claude Scruggs and Annabel Mills Scruggs.

She spent much of her childhood in the coal mining communities of West Virginia, where her father was camp doctor, and in Monticello, FL and Charleston, WV. Alice graduated from Charleston High School in 1936 and attended Marshall State College (University) in Huntington, WV, then began her long career in the secretarial field. She served in the U.S. Army Signal Corps in World War II, working at the Crosley Radio Corporation in Cincinnati, OH, which helped pioneer the development of military radar systems. Alice married James William Bell in 1944, and they raised four children in Falls Church, VA and in the Southwest Atlanta, GA community of Cascade Heights. In 1969, she embarked on a 26-year career as a legal secretary with the Georgia Association of Educators (GAE). Her many avid interests included photography, birdwatching, gardening, travel, classical music and opera, drawing and painting, genealogy, and piano.

Alice is survived by her children: Becky Greenway, Chris (Linda) Bell, and Lydia Vogtner; four grandchildren: Julie Griffin, Mindy Reynolds, Lee Greenway, and Kasey Bell; and five great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband of 48 years, James Bell, and son Michael Bell. In lieu of

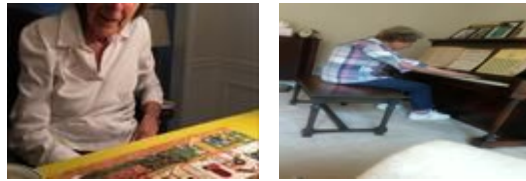

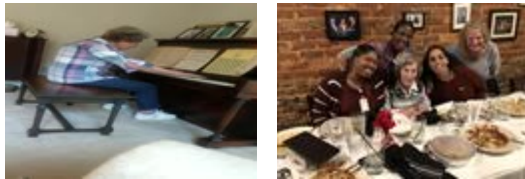

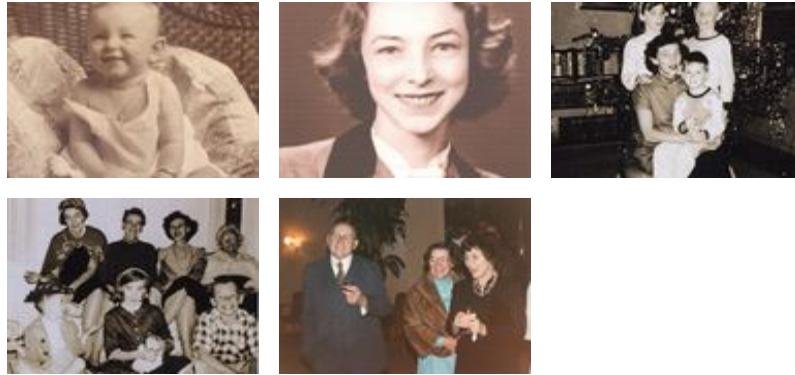
