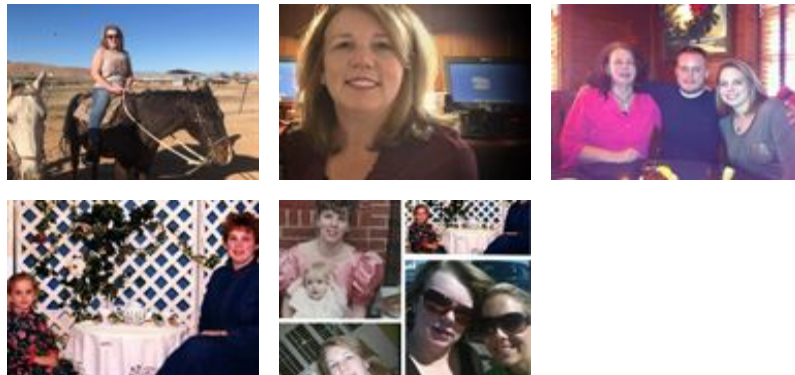

For these past 2 + years I had the honor of communicating with her almost daily, spending many hours and days together, sometimes laughing, sometimes crying, looking forward to the future and remembering the past. In all of this her faith never waivered. Even though she didn't understand the reason for such pain and suffering, she knew that God was sovereign in all things. She knew that someday she would be in heaven with David and Joanna. That someday came

suddenly and sooner than expected, but at least my heart can rejoice that they are reunited for eternity.
