Ina Ann Ray Jones died on June 16, 2025 at Great Oaks Senior Living in Monroe, Georgia. 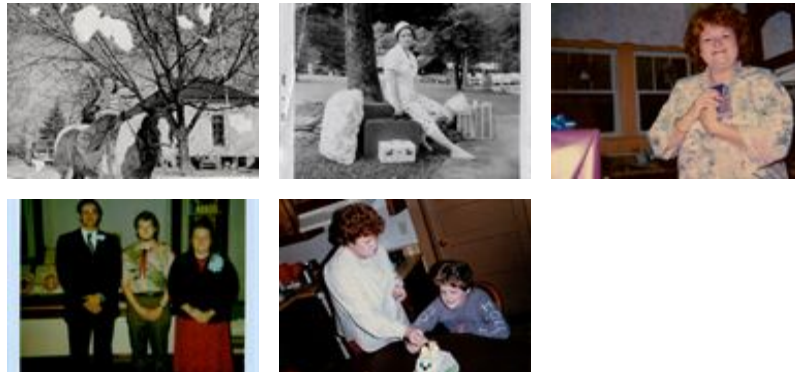
