BRAMBLETT- Robert L. Bramblett, Jr. (Bob), 80, of Stone Mountain, GA, passed away on December 14, 2023. A Funeral Service will be held at 3 PM on Tuesday, December 19, 2023 in the Monroe Chapel of Tim Stewart Funeral Home with Rev. David Adams officiating. Interment will follow at Rest Haven Cemetery.

He was born to Robert Lee Bramblett and Sara Emma Peters Bramblett in 1943 in Newton County, GA. He graduated in 1961 from Cross Keys High School in DeKalb County, GA and went on to receive a BBA from the University of Georgia. He served in the United States Marine Corps Reserve from 1966-1972.

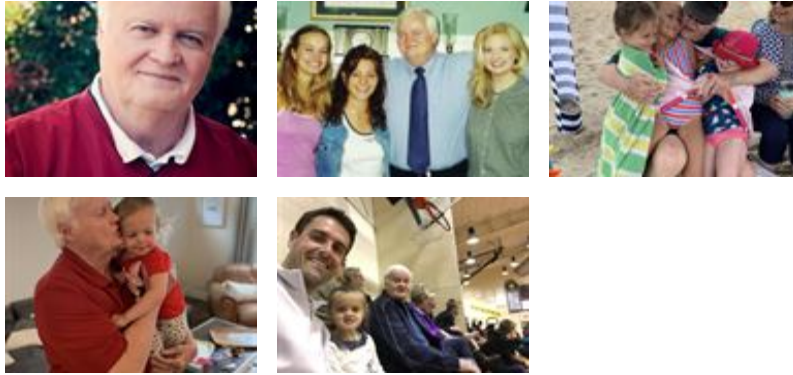

“ I’m at the age where loss is becoming a part of life. I’m losing my hair. I’ve lost weight. I’m losing my balance, and on it goes. The hardest losses are the losing loved ones and friends. Sometimes they are one and the same. Both of my parents have crossed over, and their brothers and sisters, my uncles and aunts have too. On Thursday night around 10:30 I lost one of those friends who was also a loved one: Bob Bramblett.

I met Bob through a mutual friend while working at GA Power. I liked him immediately, though we were polar opposites personality wise. Bob was quiet and analytical. I was loud and unorganized. They say opposites attract, and I guess that’s true. One thing we had in common, a deep, abiding faith in the Lord Jesus. We became fast friends.

Later, as time traveled on, he became my boss. My time working with Bob was the best of my career. Being a Marine (no such thing as ex or former) he was tough, but fair. We traveled together all over the Southeast. I can’t tell you how many breakfasts, lunches, and suppers we’ve shared.

One particular trip I’ll never forget, and I never let Bob forget it either. We were on the way Birmingham for a meeting, and stopped at Cracker Barrel for breakfast. After we finished, as was his custom, he wandered the store while I paid the check. Suddenly I heard a woman’s voice say, “Bobby, is that you?” I turned around to see who it was, and Bob was looking at me. His face was as red as Santa’s hat. She was an old classmate of his from Cross Keys High School, and had obviously had a rougher life than Bob. I finished paying as they talked. She was really glad to see him. I said not a word until we got in the car. When we were under way I said, “Bobby, is that you?” In my best female voice. He turned red again

and said, "Of all the people to witness that, it had to be you Freeman." I burst out laughing. From that day forward I would randomly say that phrase. I got a red face every time.

One more story...

Bob's complexion was the lightest I'd ever seen. He was Johnny Winter white. I often told him he was the whitest guy I know. This was especially true on the first tee at the golf course. Bob favored white crew socks for golf. This was fine except in Summer. You couldn't tell socks from legs. When the teasing started he'd just smile, then step up and out drive me by 20 yards. After he smashed it he'd look at me and wink.

I could go on, but I won't. I will say this, Bob was the best person I ever worked for. He was the best family man I ever knew. He was a "real" Christian, solid and true. Bob was a dweller on the threshold. Thursday night December 14, 2023 he stepped over. He'd lived his life in the Hope of Glory. Now he lives in the reality of that Hope. May his memory be a blessing to all who loved him.

I can't wait to say, "Bobby, is that you?", one more time.
