“ *The Story of Bob and Glenda Corbin*

Bob and Glenda (my parents) eloped and got married instead of graduating high school their senior year. They were living in Memphis and drove to DeSoto County, Mississippi to get married without waiting for a blood test. At the last minute they brought Glenda's mother Vera with them on the elopement. The family thought they were too young to get married, and that it would not last. They were married sixty-five years when Glenda passed away in October 2018.

They were married in Aug 1953 and had me 13 months later in September of 1954.

My Dad got a job as a warehouseman for the Crain Plumbing Co. They promoted him to salesman and gave him a territory in southern Florida. We moved to Florida when I was six months old. He was a salesman for about a year when he joined as partner with a plumbing contracting business. Dad ran the Plumbing, Paint and Hardware Store, and his partner ran the plumbing contracting business.

After about seven years Bob declared bankruptcy and we left the Miami area. We moved to the Tampa area where Glenda's father (John Snipes) hired Dad to work for him in an auto repair shop and trained him to be a claims adjuster. After a few years Bob was able to get a Claims Adjuster job with an insurance company. The company moved us to Stone Mountain, Georgia. Bob worked as an insurance adjuster for the next 40 years, first twenty years as a home and auto adjuster and the rest of his working career in fraud, arson, and major catastrophes management.

Before we left the Miami area we received Jesus and were saved, and all three of us (Dad, Mom & myself) were baptized together. My Dad started teaching Sunday School right away because you learn more when you have to teach a class than just attend a class. My

Dad taught Sunday School the rest of his life. I will always remember him going through the Baptist Quarterly every Saturday afternoon while preparing his lessons.

My mother always looked for and found the good in everyone. I once told her she could find the good in Adolf Hitler. She took it as a compliment.

My Dad was a “doer”, especially when it came to his family. He was always painting your house or cleaning your wooden decks, etc.

Family was the most important thing for Glenda and Bob. They had 4 children, 4 grand children and 5 great grand children. Even after their children were grown they were always there with resources and support.

Their legacy is not a large pile of money; their legacy is their family.
