“ I asked Papa what he felt was his Greatest accomplishment? His response was “Meeting Nana and creating his Family gifted from God”. I asked Where did you and Nana meet? “Nana came down here to Gwinnett from Brockton, Ga. North of Gainesville. “Paw” Harold Britt, (Stephanie’s Stepdad) was renting the hotel in Downtown Lawrenceville at the time from Hugh Britt. That is where Papa met Nana. Nana was a part-time server working for Harold. Oddly enough, Mom (Stephanie) and Dad (Ronnie) meeting was unrelated to the Moore’s and Britt’s families. Papa (Charles) and Nana (Laura) dated a year or year and half. Everyone went to the restaurant on main floor of the Britt Hotel during lunch hour. Papa wanted to see Nana at lunch. After work Papa would pick Nana up. Papa said he was kind of like me, had a different car every three or four months. In 1960 he was working for Gwinnett Sales and Service Ford where he drove new ford demos for 15 years. He was an Automotive Parts Man. Nana asked Papa to marry her (so he says). He was almost 25. His first demo was a 1960 Ford Falcon with a 4cyl, it got 25-30 mpg. He drove over 100 demos. Married in 1955. He worked at Ford by the Hotel in Lawrenceville. Papa worked for a few different dealerships labeling parts department bins at night. Papa took Nana to Stone Mountain and that is the night they became engaged. He never missed a paycheck for 41 years. The business changed names in 1964 but he kept working for them. First week of January every year, his boss gave him a raise, he never had to ask for one. Maybe a \$5/week raise. Maybe equal to \$100/week now. On the birth year of Uncle Johnny, he got a \$25 raise, same with Aunt Cindy, and Dad (Ronnie). One year he got \$200 a week raise, after the boss found out they had just had their 4th child, Aunt Melinda. He earned 1-4day vacation per quarter. He told me that he never put more than 1200 to 1500 miles on demos before he traded for another model. Nana always loved having the new cars around with the latest safety features. When he retired, he bought Nana the Cadillac she had always wanted and deserved. Then he bought himself the truck he had always wanted, paid for as they drove off the lot. They retired to Grayson and the rest was history. He bought enough land to move all his family out

there, if they wanted, so they could be with him and Nana.
