GARRETT-Cornelia Garrett, age 68 of Loganville, passed away Thursday May 8, 2008. She has been known to juggle, prioritize & maintain her sense of humor while caring for her patients. "She filled us up with her contagious laughter, her warmth, and energy. No one could keep up with her as she ran down the hall saying 'just a minute Hon, I have to take care of my patients', She is the ultimate wife, mother and sister.
