Dr. Story was the husband of 65 years of Wilma P. Story (who predeceased him on February 19, 2008), and the loving father of three sons, Edward Cullen of Bethlehem, GA (husband of Judy), John Lyle of Virginia Beach, VA (husband of Sherri), and Donald James of Glendale Heights, IL (husband of Carolyn). He had seven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by two brothers, John and Joseph, and two sisters, Sara and Ann.

An ordained minister, Dr. Story and his wife served the Presbyterian Church as home missionaries in South Dakota and North Carolina, and as foreign missionaries in Lebanon. He received advanced degrees from Johns Hopkins University and Princeton Theological Seminary. The greatest part of his academic career was as an associate professor of New Testament and director of the summer language program at Princeton Theological Seminary, where he taught Biblical languages and exegesis for 27 years beginning in 1967. After his retirement, he continued to teach at various seminaries and served as an occasional interim pastor and teacher in churches in New Jersey and Kentucky. He wrote five books (one with his son Lyle) and a number of journal articles.

Dr. Story will be remembered as a rigorous teacher and caring pastor to his many students, a person of deep commitment to the Gospel, and one who

was concerned with issues of social justice and peace. To his family, he was generous with encouragement in their pursuits, interest in their lives, prayers on their behalf, and voluminous letters.

“ I was one of the last lucky students to take a course with Prof. Story at Princeton Seminary. In the spring of 1991, he taught Advanced Greek Grammar. It was a rigorous class--we had a quiz every day and translated Plato--but it was also quite stimulating.

I have clear, fond memories of the course. Prof. Story's explanation of the preposition "pros" in John 1:1 has influenced the way I read the gospel. Prof. Story once offered a donut to anyone who could translate a particularly difficult sentence in Plato's Apology. He picked me to do it and bought me said donut even though I just muddled through it. Our final was a marathon reading of the Apology in the basement of Stuart that lasted until midnight. It was a lot more fun than it sounded.

What I remember most about Prof. Story was how his great learning was coupled with equally great love for students. On the day he bought my donut, he sat down and chatted with me for the entire coffee break period. He invited the entire class to his home for an end-of-semester party. We played parlor games that were great fun, and Prof. Story was the funnest of all participants.

When I applied to graduate programs in New Testament, Prof. Story wrote letters of recommendation for me, and I'm sure they carried much weight. He played a pivotal role in my career as a New Testament scholar. Similarly, I know quite a few other PTS students who praise Prof. Story as one of the finest mentors they ever had the privilege to know. I hope that my teaching can have even a portion of the impact that his did.
