Davis- Mr. Dale Davis age 83, of Lilburn, passed away Thursday, January 1, 2009. Memorial Service will be held 11:00AM Tuesday, January 6, 2009 in Snellville Chapel. Born July 25, 1925 in Watonga Oklahoma. Mr. Davis graduated from high school in Burlingame, Kansas in 1943, and was immediately drafted into the Army. Served in Europe, participated in Battle of Bulge and liberation of concentration camps. He was a cost accountant and National Director of Cost Control at Simmons Company where he retired in 1987 after thirty-seven years of employment. Transferred from Kansas City to Columbus, Ohio; Munster, Indiana, and ultimately to Atlanta, where he settled in Lilburn in 1978. He was a member of the Yellow River Bass Club, the H2U organization and the Computer Users Group at the Gwinnett Senior Center and a long time birding group, with which he took many birding trips. He loved fishing, birding, nature, and his cats. Survivors include his wife of 60 years: Theda Wehrle Davis of Lilburn; sisters: Gerri Dorr and Marilyn (Larry) Elgin, both of Burlingame, Kansas, Ardelle Tillisch of Kansas City; brothers: Gary (Nancy) Davis of Monroe, Virginia, Kent (Linda) Davis of Topeka, Kansas; several nieces and nephews.
