



## Dwight Timothy "Tim" Still

March 4, 1954 - June 5, 2026

STILL - Dwight Timothy "Tim" Still, age 72, of Lawrenceville, Georgia, passed away on Friday, June 5, 2026, surrounded by his loving family.

He was interred at Shiloh Primitive Baptist Church on Saturday, June 6, 2026, in a private family graveside service.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, June 20, 2026, at 11:00 a.m. at Shiloh Primitive Baptist Church, 5900 Highway 81, Loganville, GA 30052.

Visitation and a luncheon will follow in the fellowship hall.

Born on March 4, 1954, to William Lee Still and Mary Elizabeth Edwards Still, Tim was firstborn of siblings Daniel Gregory Still, Lisa Marie Still Stanley, and Kenneth Lee Still. He came of age on the family farm in a special place fondly known as "Stillville" which shaped him deeply. He loved the land, the work, and the life of the farm so much that he and his loving wife, Sylvia, later chose to raise their own children there. The farm remained one of the great loves of his life.

Tim loved God, his family, summer, sunshine, the water, playing the guitar, tossing around a Frisbee, and the laughter and energy of children at play. He was a vivid storyteller, a faithful friend, a protector, an advocate, and a hard worker. He carried through life a strong "can do" attitude and a natural gift for

problem solving. He thrived in farm work, building projects, operating tractors and other large machinery. He was always willing to teach someone who truly wanted to learn, and he took great satisfaction in helping others understand and do things well. He loved camping and going to concerts and festivals with his cherished wife and best friend, Sylvia.

A 1972 graduate of South Gwinnett High School, Tim went on to attend Oxford College and Emory University, where he received his Master of Medical Science degree in 1978.

A diplomate of the American Board of Radiology, Tim took great pride in his work as a medical physicist, a career through which he helped many thousands of cancer patients. His work reflected his intelligence, precision, and deep commitment to using his gifts in service of others. For a man so driven, self-sufficient, and capable, the last six years of his life following a cerebral hemorrhage were perhaps his most difficult challenge, which he met with quiet resolve and a desire to be a comfort to those around him.

Tim is survived by his beloved wife of 49 years, Sylvia Irene Gibson Still; his brother, Kenneth Lee Still and his wife, Leigh Ann; his children, Amber Lee Still Vachon and her husband, Paul, Megen Elizabeth Still, and Callie David Still and his wife, Courtney; and his grandchildren, Kevin Michael Still, Gibson Carter Tuggle, Jean-Paul Marie Vachon, Kateri Marie Vachon, Daisy Lane Still, Iris Jane Still, Violet Lee Still, and Asa William Still. He is also survived by numerous nieces, nephews, cousins, extended family members, and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents, William Lee Still and Mary Elizabeth Edwards Still, and by his sister, Lisa Marie Still Stanley.

Tim's family extends their heartfelt gratitude to the caregivers of Agape Hospice, whose kindness, compassion, and attentive care served him and

supported his family during the last two weeks of his life.

“ Tim is first and foremost, a Man of God, Christian Role Model, and Loving Patriarch for his family. In addition, Tim is also a World-renowned medical physicist, known for his incredible skills in analyzing computer architecture interfaces with Complex Technological Platforms. I was first introduced to Tim, during the Therac-25 incidents. I was living in Canada, at the time, and my first clinical Linac was an early prototype version of the Therac-25. I knew all the Technological Group at (AECL)-Theratronics, who were investigating the incident(s) and they often mentioned Tim's name in discussions. It was Tim's tireless work, during this period, which led to the incorporation of Hardware Interlocks to correct the over-reliance of Software Control. This new operating paradigm, shifted the integration of Software-Hardware engineering protocols into the manufacturing landscape in Radiation Oncology. I first arrived in Georgia in 2004, when I took the position of Chief Medical Physicist at Northeast Georgia Medical Center, in Gainesville Georgia. In 2007, I was directly linked with Tim at Wellstar, Kennestone as we both were responsible for Commissioning Elekta Synergy Linacs to utilize the Pinnacle Treatment Planning system. There was a major issue with Pinnacle as Version 8 had just introduced the Rounded Leaf Edge of the MLC into the calculation algorithm. As a result of this collaboration, I was able to solve the Version 8 model MLC issues. Have met Tim, it was not long before we realized we had a lot in common with respect to large old 3-phase manufacturing equipment. My focus was mainly on woodworking, while Tim was more focused on Agricultural equipment. Our paths would directly cross when I hired Tim to work at Northeast Georgia Medical Center, which allowed us an opportunity to have many discussions on a wide range of topics. It is hard to express the level of loss of such a wonderful Man, in our lives, and my condolences go out to Sylvia and Family at this time of Grief. We will miss Tim, but know he is not gone, just traveled to a better place to be with God.
