January 7, 1927 - January 7, 2013

Eloise Aycock, named Dorothy Eloise by her parents Leroy and Edna Thompson, was born on January 7, 1927, near Hermitage, Arkansas. She and her younger brother, John, moved to Shreveport, Louisiana, with their parents when Eloise was twelve. From the time that she was a young girl Eloise knew that she wanted to become a nurse. World War II assisted Eloise in her process of becoming a nurse. The U. S. government trained her in New Orleans with the understanding that she would join the nursing corps and provide care for the soldiers fighting in the war. However, World War II ended just prior to Eloise graduating from nursing school, so she never served in the military. Eloise spent what she would describe as the best part of her life working as a nurse for the late Dr. R. D. Crow of Shreveport. Eloise was loved by all the multiple generations of patients that met her at Dr. Crow's office over the years. Eloise married Frank Leslie Baker, Jr. on October 16, 1946, at the age of 19. They lost their first baby, Patricia, immediately after her birth in 1947. Their son, John, was born August 11, 1948 and was followed almost three years later by their daughter, Janice, who was born on March 14, 1951. Eloise passed away after a lengthy illness and short hospital stay in Athens, Georgia, on January 7, 2013, her 86th birthday. Eloise is survived by her son John Baker and his wife, Dianne, of Houston, Texas, and her daughter, Janice Turber, and her husband, Bob, of Loganville, Georgia. Eloise is also survived by three step-children -Raymond Aycock from the Shreveport area, Kathy Nattin from Bossier City, and Ralph Aycock. Eloise is also survived by four

grandchildren - Regan Baker, his wife Dana, and their son, Walker of Houston, Texas; Ryan Baker and his wife, Renee, of London, Ontario, Canada; Brian Daughtery, his wife, Jana, and their son, Liam, of Loganville, Georgia; and Kristy Chandler of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and her children, Glendon and Brinna, of Loganville, Georgia. Eloise is also survived by three step-grandchildren-Ronda Holladay, her husband, Taylor , and Ronda's children, Caroline Fitzgerald and Max Palermo, of Houston, Texas.
