F. Raymond Street, 79, of Snellville, GA passed away Thursday, October 29, 2015 at Scepter Personal Care. For over 40 years, Mr. Street was a dedicated member of Bethany Baptist Church where he served as Deacon, Treasurer and Sunday School Teacher.
