In such tender loss, the depth of which an individual can only know so privately, even great statesmen have struggled in offering words of comfort. Some of the most moving words on loss may be found in a letter written by President Lincoln, to a Mrs. Bixbe on November 21, 1864, for a mother who has lost five sons to the Civil War. Battlefields aside, these are perhaps the most eloquent words offering comfort to any deeply grieving heart. I quote from President Lincoln's letter:

"I feel how weak and fruitless must be any words of mine, which would attempt to beguile you from the grief of a loss so overwhelming...I pray that our Heavenly Father may assuage the anguish of your bereavement, and leave you only the cherished memory of those loved, and lost..."

While weak and fruitless any words of mine may also be, perhaps some comfort may be derived in knowing Frank is remembered by many, with respect, admiration, and love. His tangible absence will never be overcome, yet he is carried in the hearts, memories and prayers of the many lives he has touched. I humbly submit my deepest condolences to your grieving hearts.
