Smith – Frank Smith

Age 93 of Grayson passed away, Tuesday, November 16, 2010. Funeral Services will be held at 11 AM, Friday, November 19, 2010 in the Snellville Chapel of Tim Stewart Funeral Home, with Bishop Bolt officiating. Burial to follow at Eternal Hills Memory Gardens, Snellville.

Mr. Smith was raised on a farm until 1933 when he went into the CCC's and was stationed in Old town of Fort Lauderdale on the Suwanee River, he was discharged in 1934 and went home to Camp Hill, AL to help on the farm. On July 17, 1935, he enlisted in the US Army at Ft. Benning, GA, and in 1937 he was stationed in the Philippine Islands in the 31st Infantry. In 1939 he caught a freighter back to the Philippines and worked for the US Quarter Master Port in Manila PI. He was captured on Corregidor by the Japanese on April 6, 1942 to be a slave laborer, building air fields around Manila. In 1944 he was sent to Japan until Liberated in August 1945, he then went home to Camp Hill, AL; from there to Atlanta where he met his wife Jessie and together raised 4 sons.

Mr. Smith was preceded in death by his son, Thomas Smith; and is survived by his Wife: Jessie Smith, Grayson; Sons & Daughters-in-law: Jeff & Sydney Smith, Bishop, GA; Keith & Sandy Smith; Gregory Smith, all of Grayson; Brothers & Sisters-in-law: Joe D. Smith, AL; Paul Leroy & Mary Louise Smith, Thomson; Tommy & Nell Dykes, FL; Sisters & Brother-in-law: Vivian Miller, LaGrange; Mary Lou Webster, Jonesboro; Mae & Don Owen, Clarkston;

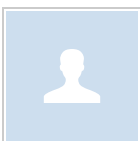
