Frank Theodore Stoffle, Sr., died peacefully on May 8, 2021, at the age of 98. He was living in the home of his daughter and son-in-law, Patty and Ken Lindahl, in Snellville, Georgia. He was born on April 22, 1923 in Coloma, Michigan, to Hermine and Dominick Stoffle. He was preceded in death by his wife, Lee Parvin Stoffle. She was born on July 8, 1926 in Alabama and passed away on September 11, 2016.

They met at the end of WWII in Gulfport, Mississippi, and married. Frank took his bride back to Michigan where they spent most of their lives, until moving to the Atlanta area in 1982. 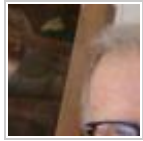
