The family will receive friends Tuesday, November 29th from 4:00 pm until 9:00 pm at the funeral home and from noon until the time of the service on Wednesday. I met Glenn during the spring of 2004, and I am one of those people who became friends with Glenn in the context as it was written in his obituary that he never met a stranger. I remember calling Lynn when I was looking for Rhododendron, and that he invited me out to his nursery. As it turns out, I bought several truckloads of plants and trees from him. These plants and trees have prospered and grow quite large in my front yard, and I will always think of him as I look out and see them. I was proud to have become somewhat of a friend to Glenn, the crowning moment of which, is that he asked me during the summer of 2004 to take him over to Athens, to visit a number of commercial plant growers. I drove from Atlanta out to Lawrenceville, and picked up Glenn, and we drove over to Athens and visited several nurseries, and Packed my truck with dozens of new small plants for Glenn to nurture. We stopped along the way and had lunch, and I listened as he shared many stories. We came from different generations, walks of life and cities. None of that mattered as we laughed and I enjoyed learning from him. He was the epitome of a gentleman, an excellent human being. We spoke by phone until he moved out of his house, and I tried to find where I could go visit him, but was unsuccessful. I was very saddened open the newspaper the other day and see Glenn's obituary.
