Hobby Jackson Bomar Jr., affectionately known as Sonny to his family and Jack to his friends, passed away peacefully at the age of ninety on March 29, 2024, at his daughter's home in Lawrenceville, Georgia. Born on March 21, 1934 in Manning, South Carolina, Hobby was the youngest son of the late Hobby Jackson Bomar, Sr. and the late Ethel Brickman Bomar. Throughout his life, he was a good and strong man.

Hobby served in the Army for 27 years, retiring as a Colonel. A veteran of the Vietnam war, most of his military career was served abroad. He retired in Belgium where he lived for many years, and twenty years ago, he and his wife Monique decided to move back to Hobby's roots in Manning, South Carolina.

Hobby was a wonderful husband, married to Monique Lheureux Bomar for 48 years. He was the best father a daughter could dream of to Karin Monique Bomar, his only child. He read stories, helped write papers for school, made sure she could travel and fly with her own wings as an independent woman. Hobby was also the grandfather of two beautiful girls, Maya Ethel Makau (9) and Sophia Katemi Makau (6), who loved him dearly.

Hobby's life journey will be commemorated with a funeral mass at Our Lady of Hope Catholic Church in Manning, where Rev. Antony Benjamin will officiate. The mass will be on Friday, April 5, 2024, at 11 AM, allowing friends, family,

and those whose lives were touched by Hobby to come together in honor of a life well-lived.

Hobby will be laid to rest at the Manning Cemetery, where he will be surrounded by the community he so dearly loved. In the wake of his passing, the family will welcome friends and loved ones to join them in fellowship and remembrance immediately following the graveside service. This gathering will be an opportunity to share memories, offer comfort, and celebrate the immeasurable impact that Hobby had on all who knew him.

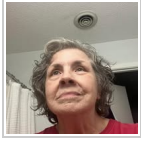
