



## Dr. James A. Fisher

June 8, 1942 - April 9, 2021

Fisher – Dr. James A. Fisher, Sr, age 78 of Hoschton, GA passed away on Friday, April 9, 2021. A celebration of life service will be held at 2:00 PM on Saturday, May 8, 2021 at First Baptist Winder in Winder, GA. Attendees are invited to wear bright colors as we celebrate with happy memories. A native of Tacoma Park, MD, Dr. Fisher was a son of the late Kenneth Frank Fisher, Sr. and Stella Elizabeth Blose. Dr. Fisher was a proud graduate of Montgomery Blair High School (1960), Florida Southern College (1964), Wake Forest University (1972), and Middle Tennessee State University (1974) where he joined the Kappa Alpha fraternity. An educator for over 50 years, he was most recently the former Assistant Dean of Shorter College in Atlanta. Dr. Fisher was proud to have served on the School Board of Gwinnett County, GA, and leaves a legacy of thousands of students who fondly remember his teaching and stories about History, Geography and World Religions. Dr. Fisher was known by many names including Jimmy, Jim, Dad, Pop Pop, Uncle Jimmy, Mr. Fisher, Pops, Dr. Fish, and by his older brother Kenny as a Plout. He had an immense love of family with his favorite time of year being Christmas and the many gatherings which took place during the season. His love of travel took him all over the world, where he always made friends. Jim had a natural gift for languages and never missed an opportunity to speak to someone in their native language. He will be remembered for his infectious sense of humor, love of cinnamon rolls and Ledo's pizza, chef of the best chocolate chip cookies, and master of Words with Friends. Most importantly, Jim was a

Christian who lived his life by example and is sure to be enjoying his reward in heaven.

He is survived by his loving wife of over forty-four (44) years Ann (King) Fisher of Hoschton, GA, Daughter and Son-in-law: Elizabeth and Jeffrey Kinsinger of Lilburn, GA, Son and Daughter-in-law: Jimmy and Allison Fisher of Buford, GA, Daughter and Son-in-law: Alice and Gary Davis of Winder, GA, Brother: Kenneth Fisher of Fredericksburg, VA, Grandchildren: Lucy, Aidan, Tyler, Peyton, Ella Kaitlin, David and Kelton, as well as many cousins, nieces, and nephews.
