A member of The Orchard Church, Mr. Green served on the Board of Directors and committed his life to helping others, especially people involved in 12-Step Recovery Programs. He also met with "At-Risk" teens each month at the Walton County Juvenile Center. James was a Vietnam veteran and an independent electrical contractor in the Metro-Atlanta area. 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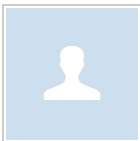
