Jean H. Weaver died Sunday, November 8, 2009 in Loganville, GA at the age of 89. She was born in Youngstown, OH on June 11, 1920 to Benjamin F. Harmony and Bertha M. Brown. Jean first attained a Bachelor of Science degree in Education from Kent State University in Kent, OH. She went on to attain a Master of Arts degree in Hearing and Speech Therapy from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, OH. For over 40 years, Jean was committed to teaching hearing impaired children at all grade levels in the Youngstown, OH school system. She was married 45 years to E. R. "Buck" Weaver, who passed away on January 11, 2006. Jean and Buck lived in Canfield, OH nearly 25 years, and eventually retired to Hendersonville, NC in 1986. Jean was a world traveler and actively involved in gardening, photography, aviation, and the Lutheran church. She also served a number of years with the League of Women Voters. Jean is survived by her son Mark and his wife Elizabeth Weaver of Monroe, GA.
