



Julienne Elizabeth Carter

December 24, 1920 - March 28, 2017

Carter - Julienne Elizabeth Carter was born on Christmas Eve, 1920 and passed away on March 28, 2017 at Life Care Center in Lilburn, Ga. surrounded by her family and a loving staff that cared for her in her last 3 years and universally considered her a consistently upbeat, positive resident. Julienne spent her youth in Brooklyn, NY and Pittsburgh, Penn, moving to Atlanta and graduating from North Fulton High School in 1938. She met and married Sgt. Joe Carter of San Diego, Calif. during WWII and moved to San Diego. She returned to Atlanta in 1946 to live with her parents and raise her children. Julienne is pre-deceased by her parents, Charles and Lillian Perreault, sister Naomi Reilly and brother Maurice Perreault of Birmingham, Ala. She is survived by children Pat Lowrie, Joe Carter and Kathy Powitchko, 6 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. Known for her work ethic, Julienne was ahead of the curve for women of her time, entering the business world armed with only a high school education, but owning 2 businesses and working for State Farm into her early 80's. A lifetime Christian woman, she sang in the choir of Lawrenceville Presbyterian Church into her late 80's. Julienne mentioned to her children in the last week of her life that she was ready to go home and the Lord took her at her word, enfolding her in His grace and bringing her to His Heavenly Home. Her ashes will be interred at Crestlawn Cemetery in Atlanta beside those of her parents and sister. A memorial service will be held at Lawrenceville Presbyterian Church at 11:00 AM on April 4, 2017.
