“ My husband and I have known Ken and Barbara for 14 years. We first moved into the neighborhood then and live right across the street from them.

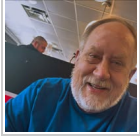

I would continuously try and get advice on parenting and life in general. He knew exactly when to intervene and exactly when to let me know he couldn't ibtervine and these would have to be decisions I come to on my own.

My only wish is that now he is in a better place. No longer struggling with a physical and mental hadicap. I only hope I can pass his knowledge and beliefs more completely into myself and those around me for generations to come!
