Mr. Kenneth Doten Robertson, age 86, of Lawrenceville, Georgia, formerly of Madison, Indiana entered this life on November 6, 1932 in Lynn, Massachusetts. He was the loving son of the late Kenneth D. Robertson, Sr. and Irene F. Breason Robertson. He graduated from Norwood, Massachusetts High School in 1952. On May 13, 1955 he married Clara E. Robinson in Newark, Delaware. This marriage was blessed with a daughter Sheril, and sons Kenneth, Brian and David. He attended UCLA for 2 years. He was inducted into the United States Army and served in the Reserves in 1951. He then entered active duty on January 26, 1953 in Boston, Massachusetts serving in the 1264 319th STA Hospital. He rose to the rank of Corporal during the Korean War and was honorably discharged on December 30, 1954 in New Jersey. He was raised in Massachusetts and in the 1950's he owned and operated Robertson's Roll Land Skating Rink and worked nine years with E.I. Dupont in Seaford, Delaware as a machine operator. He also worked at Shore Diver's in Delaware and helped train State Police to become divers. Kenneth retired from Foamex in Saddle Brook, New Jersey. He had served as plant manager in Commerce, California from 1971-1994 and then worked as a consultant with the plant manager until 2000. He lived in Ft. Wayne, Indiana from 1994-1998, then moved to Madison in 2000. In 2014 he moved to Lawrenceville, Georgia to be near his daughter. He was a member of Madison

Assembly of God Church in Madison for several years and later Cornerstone Community Fellowship Church. He also held membership in the Legion Riders, Major Samuel Woodfill Post No. 9 of the American Legion, the Robertson Clan Daughtery-Scotland International Clans and was a 15 year participant and the official athletic judge for the Highland Games, and the DeMolay King Arthur Chapter in Norwood, Massachusetts. Ken loved riding his motorcycles especially his 3-wheeler, diving, flying his Cessna 206, going off road in his custom Jeep, and competing in archery. He loved his Country and was very patriotic. He was united in marriage to Rossy Hill on July 5, 2018 in Lawrenceville. Ken was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in 2018 and fought a courageous battle. Kenneth died on Thursday, January 24, 2019, at 4:30 a.m. at his home in Lawrenceville, Georgia.
