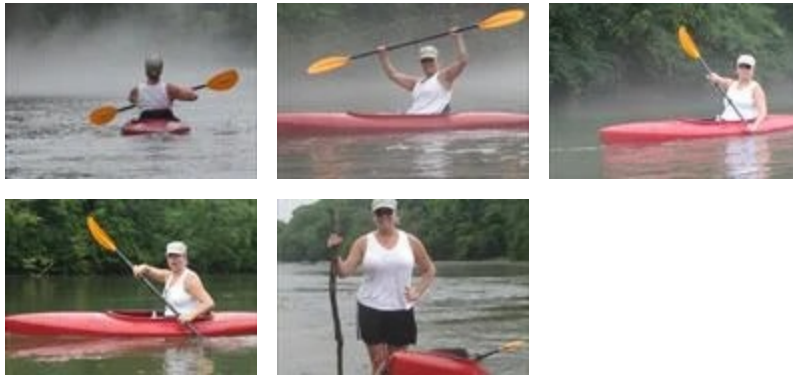

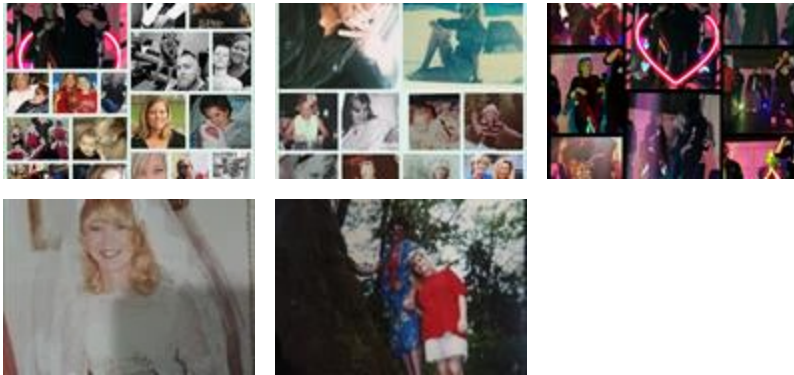

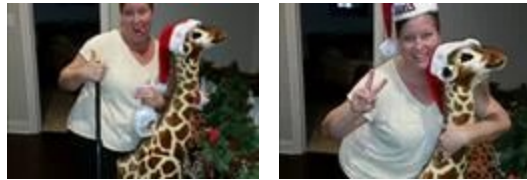
last performance, and a pictures of her childhood and early life as well. There is so much to go through.
