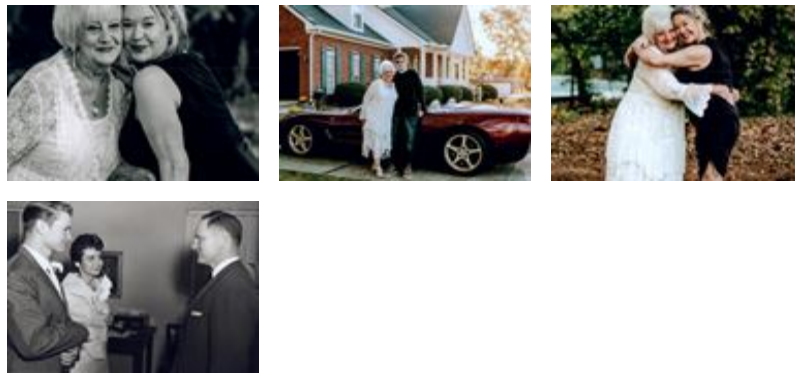

“ *Loretta was my very first paraprofessional at Mountain Park Elementary School in Gwinnett County. She was a delight to work with each day and loved me and all the children so much and we all loved her. My favorite memory of sweet Loretta happened in the teacher’s lounge (back when schools had such a place). Someone came in and said that they had just heard that it was going to snow that night. Loretta hit the floor and started praying for snow so we would have a “snow day” when we would not be in school. A funny story she told us one day was about she and Norman taking the boys to a cafeteria to eat lunch after church one Sunday. One of the boys didn’t know that you paid for every item individually. He just loaded his tray with everything that looked good resulting in a very high tab even in the early 1970’s. Loretta was a devoted Christian and she lived her life so that everyone knew she was a Christian. I live in Loganville and we would occasionally see each other when we were shopping. It was always delightful to see her. I know she is in Heaven with our Savior and Norman and others in her family. I know I will never forget her and her sweet and kind spirit.*
