Mary Dunham Scott, born a twin on May 11, 1929, in Brockton, MA, died in Stone Mountain, GA on October 5, 2021, surrounded by love.

Mary and her late twin Ann (Dunham Woodward) lived in Brockton and Wellesley MA, with their late parents Laura Edna Foye Dunham and Atwood P. Dunham, Sr. and their brother Atwood P. Dunham, Jr. (“Woody”). After high school, Mary and Ann were educated at the Northfield School for Girls and then Skidmore College. Mary’s major was Home Economics, with a special interest in textiles. Mary went on to work as the 4H agent for Chenango County, NY, where she met her late husband, the Reverend William T. Scott, Jr. Mary went to graduate school to study library science at the University of Rhode Island, completing her degree at Emory University. She worked as a substitute teacher and IRS data entry clerk while completing the degree, then children’s librarian in Chamblee Georgia and periodicals librarian at Pitts Theology Library. She visited much of the United States as well as Canada, England, Scotland, Italy, Finland, and Russia. She loved gardening and tennis, playing in a national championship with her USTA “senior” team in her 60s. Her grandchildren loved every chance they had to visit “Mimi.” In 2003, while living in Ormond Beach, FL she had a hemorrhagic stroke and was not expected to live 30 days. Instead, she defied the odds, working diligently at physical therapy to regain the ability to use her leg, competing with herself and others to overcome the limitations left-side weakness imposed. She and her husband moved back to Georgia in 2012, much to the delight of their

children and grandchildren. Mary's determination and love of life inspired all who knew her. She giggled and laughed her way into everyone's hearts. Besides her brother, she is survived by her four children, William Tate Scott III (Jeanette), Elizabeth D Scott, Ann Scott Price (Billy Joe), Louise Scott Fortney (Murray), two grandchildren, Z. Todd Price (Allyssa) and Colin Sarver Scott (Chelsia Yu), two great-grandchildren, Evelyn Mae Price and Cohen Scott Price, family friend Joan Tomaszewski, and many nieces, nephews, grand-nieces, and grand-nephews.
