In Loving Memory of Melvin F. (Pete) McIntosh

Melvin F. ("Pete") McIntosh, of Loganville, Georgia, passed away on November 3, 2025, surrounded by the love of his family. Born January 16, 1934 in Columbus, Ohio, Pete was the son of Melvin F. and Janet McIntosh (both deceased). He graduated from North High School and later attended The Ohio State University, beginning a lifelong pattern of hard work, kindness, and quiet generosity that defined him.

Pete built a respected career as a buyer of men's clothing, retiring from F&R Lazarus in 1982 and later Kuppenheimer in 1997. Beyond work, he served his community and faith with devotion. A lifelong Shriner, Pete was Master of the Humboldt lodge in Columbus, Ohio in 1969-70. He was an active member of Corpus Christi Catholic Church in Stone Mountain, Georgia where he sang joyfully in the choir. He loved fishing, The Ohio State Buckeyes, woodworking, gardening, and delighted friends by performing in parish musicals—including South Pacific—and once bringing laughter to the house by channeling his inner Willie Nelson in a memorable duet of "To All the Girls I've Loved Before."

Pete treasured family above all. He was married to Mary Jo McIntosh for 43 years. He is lovingly survived by his children: Steve McIntosh (Melody) of Windermere, Florida, Sue Kannapel (Keith) of Onancock, Virginia, Robert

McIntosh (Debbie) of Loganville, Georgia, and Cynthia Black of Nebraska City, Nebraska. He will be fondly remembered by his grandchildren—Jonathan and Garrett (Steve) McIntosh, David and Michael (Sue) Kannapel; and Matthew and Michael (Robert) McIntosh — and by his great-grandchildren Everett, Eden, Mason, and Landon McIntosh; and Chase and Cole Kannapel. Pete was preceded in death by his parents; his sisters, Bonnie Ijams and Judy McIntosh; and his grandson, Benjamin McIntosh. His legacy endures in the faith, humor, craftsmanship, and music he shared with all who knew him.
