



Reginald Phillip Brown

January 17, 1950 - April 6, 2025

BROWN – Today we gather to remember, honor, and to say goodbye to Reginald (Reggie) P. Brown. Taking the words of a famous writer: ‘We make a living by what we got, we make a life by what we give.’ If that is true, then Reginald had a great life. Our lives have all been touched by Reggie also known as “Baba Reggie” in some way, but you may not have known some details of his earlier life. Reginald (Reggie) Brown was born in Bronx, New York on January 17, 1950. He is one of six children for his late parents, Lorenzo and Bessie Brown. Reginald is survived by his brothers Kenneth Brown (wife Sandra) and Marvin Brown, and sisters Carolyn Brown-Hunt and Gaile Theresa Brown. He is also survived by his four nephews, five nieces, numerous grandnieces/nephews, cousins, extended family, friends and Godchildren’s: Remona Coleman (Adetoro), Cathy Pearson (Olaynipekun) and Bruce Spencer (Solabemi). Reginald graduated from Dewitt Clinton High School in Bronx, New York, and attended The City College of New York where he received his Bachelor of Science degree. He then went to attend The New York Institute of Technology where he received a Master of Science degree in Instructional Technology in December of 1999. Reginald was an educator of 41 years who taught in the daycare system in the Bronx for a year, then left and taught for 10 years in the Charleston South Carolina school system. He returned to New York where he worked as a Teacher, Technology Coordinator, Administrator, and Truant Officer at the New York City Department of Education for 30 years, where he retired to his current home in Dacula,

Georgia. A faithful man, Reginald, better known as “Baba Reggie”, chose to serve God through the path of the Yoruba Orisha religion and received his liekes in 1969 from Baba James Campbell Olufandei Ibaye and Baba Alfred Davis, Omitoki Ibaye. He was initiated to Obatala on August 19, 1984, by his Godfather Baba Alfred Davis, Omitoki Ibaye and Babe Minye Gaye, Ocha Iliu Ibaye. He then received his Obeof Ogun on May 31, 2003, from his Godparents Calvin Royal (Baba Akin Babatunde) Aladobi and Iyalosa Denise Tima Baker Osunlari. Baba Reggie was a member of the Omo Obatala Egbe since its inception. He served as a member of the Board Directors of Ijo Orisa Yoruba Church and was instrumental with its development. He became an Oluko with the Egbe Iwa Odo’Kunrin Egbe Iwa Odo’Binrin. New York Senator Kevin S. Parker honored Baba Reginald Brown and the Omo Obatala Egbe with the New York State proclamation for his Excellence in Service October 26, 2017. Baba Reggie was an elder in the Orisa community until his final transition in Dacula, Georgia on April 6, 2025. 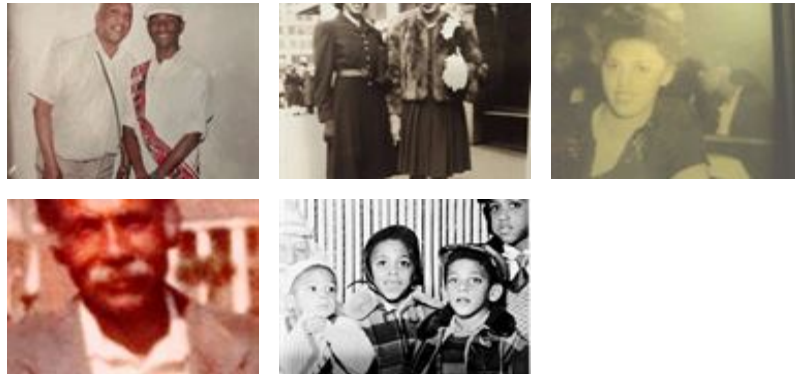
