We then drove up the coast to Nanaimo, enjoying the ride, boarded a ferry there to Vancouver, BC, and spent time in that area viewing the many attractions. The drive back to Seattle, passing through small towns was very entertaining. We then traveled south to Mt. St. Helens National Monument and to the base of Mt. Rainier in Mt. Rainier National Park. Two more of the great wonders of God. Our friend, LaNeah Dyson took the trip with us and she and Bob joked with each other along the way. Bob had so much fun. He did not let the partial paralyzed left side slow him down.

Our next trip was the next year, 2000. We flew to Las Vegas, drove north to St. George, Utah and spent eight days there. We took trips to Bryce Canyon National Park, Zion National Park, also the North rim of the Grand Canyon. That was Bob's dream come true. We got to behold some of God's most beautiful creations. He traveled back and forth for four years bringing materials to finish this home. While building this home, he visited me quite often and shared meals with my family and me. My son Todd Cody and Bob used bucket trucks in their line of work; Bob in his electrical business and Todd owned Cody Cable Company. They spent lots of time together buying, selling, trading, working on these trucks. They became very close friends.

Bob had neck surgery in 2011, and I spent four weeks in his home helping him recuperate; preparing meals, cleaning house and caring for his dog Scarlett, his constant companion. When I returned to the mountains, we talked almost daily. Todd passed away in December 2012 and Bob came to the mountains to grieve with the family. Bob's daughter, Anita died three months later, and of course we were there to comfort Bob. These losses brought so much pain to our lives that we talked daily trying to console each other. This sharing continued until January, 2014, when Bob was placed in a facility. Bob was not allowed to have a phone for six months, he missed talking with his siblings. He got his phone back and for his last nine months he called me as many as five times a day wanting me to come take him home..Bob's in his heavenly home now with no grief or frustration caused from being away from his home and Scarlett, his best friend. I feel fortunate to have been a part of the Cody family for 53 years. We will all miss Bob so very much. Bob was a Godly man, whom I respected and loved so much.

“ My brother Bob and I were very close. We were born into a family of nine children. The order of my birth was between brother Bob and brother Bruce. These two brothers and I had a lot in common because we were very close in age. When I was ten years old, Bob had a job working on a dairy farm and for Christmas he gave me a book of lifesavers(ten packs) and a ten pack of juicy fruit gum. That was 65 years ago and still very vivid in my mind today. Little things in life do matter. Bob graduated high school in 1955, drafted into the army and spent time in Germany. We corresponded by mail and I have pictures of several countries he visited in Europe, while serving in Germany.

When Bob returned home to Waynesville,NC, there were no jobs here, so he went to Pasadena, Texas to work for Champion Paper Company. He worked long hours to provide the very best for his wife and three children. Bob attended school, at night and weekends for several years and received his Master Electrician License. My family visited him, kept in touch by phone and he came to Waynesville two or three times a year to visit Mom and Dad and other family here. He lived in Pasadena 13 years and in 1970 moved his family to Snellville, Georgia. He built a beautiful home, a shop to house Cody Electric Company and a booming business that continued to prosper until he sold it in 2011. He was only 3 hours away from Waynesville,so we visited with each other quite often.

Bob and his wife,the three children's mother, divorced in 1978. In 1979 he married Sue and became a stepfather to her three children, the youngest, Bill was only five , Kellie and Kathy were a few years older. They built a home in Snellville, for the blended family. Bob and his family were horse enthusiasts and competed in numerous horse shows throughout the south for many years, winning blue ribbons and other awards that Bob was so proud of. Bob also enjoyed going to rodeos. Bob's son Danny who started working with him at a very young age ,drowned in 1985 at the age of 27. This was a set back for Bob and he never got over Danny's untimely Death. Bob and Sue were married for almost 20 years, the majority

of which were very fulfilled. Bob was a devout Christian and he and Sue were very involved in their church programs. Tension became so bad among the blended family that it led to Bob and Sue getting a divorce in 1999.

Bob suffered a stroke in 1998 that left him partially paralyzed on his left side. He did not fully recover from this but continued his life as usual, working every day and caring for his dog Mollie. They were a happy pair. Bob sold the home he and Sue had built in Snellville, Georgia in 2006 and bought a home a few miles away in Monroe, Georgia. His dog Mollie had died in the early 2000's and he and Scarlett, another black cocker spaniel moved into the new place. Bob lost his daughter, Anita, in March of 2013, she was only 56 years old. This was another set back that he never got over. Bob was placed in a facility in March, 2014, and thought he would get to go back home and be reunited with Scarlett, his constant companion. Sadly, this did not happen.

I love you Bro and will meet you soon walking on the streets of gold in our heavenly home where there will be no more pain or sorrow, and no one can take control of your life except your Father God.
