She lovingly embraced Terry's daughters, Stephanie and Misty, as her own, and together they welcomed daughters Amanda and Jennifer, completing the family she cherished so deeply. As a devoted Army wife for more than 40 years, Roberta embraced every adventure military life brought. Their journey took them from Fort Bragg, North Carolina, to Gelnhausen, Germany, then Wilmington, North Carolina, before finally settling in Stone Mountain/Monroe, Georgia, where they made their home for the past 26 years. Throughout her life, Roberta worked in retail, banking, and eventually retired from the Gwinnett County School System. No matter where she worked, she was known for her kindness, strong work ethic, and genuine care for others. Family was always the center of Roberta's world. She loved shopping trips, playing games,

vacationing and creating lasting memories with those she loved most. In 2009, she was honored to bring her parents from Indiana to Georgia so she could lovingly care for them during their final years-a role she considered one of life's greatest privileges. One of the greatest blessings of her life came just five years ago when she was reunited with her biological mother, Linda, and the Smith family. That reunion brought her a sense of peace and completeness that she treasured for the rest of her life. Roberta was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Terry Robert Grant, and her parents, Robert and Imogene Barnes.
