Steven David Green, lovingly known by many as “Steve,” “Stevie-D,” and “Geebs,” passed away on May 3, 2026, at the age of 58 in Loganville, Georgia.

Born in Alton, Illinois, on September 20, 1967, Steve grew up in Bourbon, Missouri, and graduated from Bourbon High School. He later spent much of his adult life in St. Petersburg, Florida, where he worked as an executive chef before moving to Atlanta, Georgia, to pursue his dream of opening his own restaurants. A chef and restaurateur at heart, Steve became the proud owner and founder of Oyster Bay Seafood Cafe and O’Shucks Seafood & Grill. Through years of hard work, creativity, and determination, he built successful seafood restaurants that became gathering places for family, friends, and the community.

Steve had a passion for creating — whether it was designing menus, renovating homes, or working with his hands. He could build or fix just about anything and was happiest when he was creating something meaningful. Outside of work, he loved boating, jet skis, the ocean, the mountains, and classic rock-n-roll.

Above all else, Steve loved God and his family deeply. He was a devoted father and was closest with his son, Tucker Green, and his daughter, Taylor

Perez. He was a loyal friend who always took care of others and gave as much of himself as he could. People will remember him as an amazing chef, a talented builder and designer, and someone whose generosity and loyalty touched many lives. One of the most meaningful moments in his life was being baptized on March 26, 2026.

Steve was preceded in death by his father, John Green; his brother, Jon Green; and his sister, Kathy Palmer. He is survived by his mother, Sharon Crow Green; his son, Tucker Green; his daughter, Taylor Perez; his son-in-law, Jorge Perez; his sister, Donna Ruble; his sister, Susan Wilson; along with many extended family members, friends, employees, and loved ones who will miss him dearly.
